

Minister's Message

Dear Friends

Lent this year begins on Wednesday 14th February, following very quickly from the end of the Christmas/Epiphany Season on 2nd February.

This is a reminder to us that the life and ministry of Jesus were very short - about a three year period between his Baptism and Crucifixion. Within this period Jesus achieved amazing things: healing and transforming many lives teaching with authority in a way that cut through the twists and turns of the teachers of the law drawing together a group of followers who would change the world leaving us a celebration meal (Communion) that would forever remind us of the meaning of his death and resurrection.

Within the scope of history our lives are very short - even though several of our congregation are already in their 90's and some will reach that landmark this year!

Even the life of our Churches takes place in a short time span within two thousand years of Christian history. Who knows where the Methodist Church and United Reformed Churches will be in 10 years time?

As we think of all that Jesus achieved within three short years we are challenged to make the most of every day, every moment. Charles Wesley shared this though when he wrote:

"I would the precious time redeem,
And longer live for this alone:
To spend, and to be spent, for them
Who have not yet my Saviour known"
Lent is a good opportunity to re assess our priorities in the light of Jesus.
