Church Defibrillator

As you know Roy and Lynne have been working with our local councillor Malcom Kelly to secure funding to purchase and install the external defibrillator cabinet and the external stab kit cabinet, both of which are now in place and we are grateful for the time and effort this took to make things happen!

The current defibrillator was obtained from the Oliver King Foundation about 10 - 12 years ago and requires new pads and batteries every 2 years to ensure the machine is viable; our current machine requires adult and child pads and they are out of date and need to be replaced, together with the battery. Roy contacted Oliver King and the cost was £312 which would last 2 years. However, Roy was also informed that our machine is now obsolete and in 2 years pads and battery will not be available and we will have to buy a new machine. Roy asked the cost of a new machine and was told £1,000+ and subsequently rang me to let me know the situation.

I suggested contacting London Hearts, a charity organisation and suggested Roy look at those prices. London Hearts support new purchases with a charity grant towards the total cost and the cost of a new one from them was £660, but the grant funding is on a first come first served basis until the next grant phase is available. The new one only requires one set of pads which last $\frac{3}{4}$ years and will be cheaper to replace and the battery lasts $\frac{5}{4}$ years.

Roy, Lynne and I chatted over the options at length and financially it did not seem the best option to pay £312 now and have to pay £1000 + in 2 years time and a new London Hearts defib seemed the sensible option. However, I explained to them that our finances are stretched at the moment and we would not be able to purchase a replacement immediately. I felt that we should ask the youth organisations if they could make a donation or arrange a fundraising event in their activities towards the cost of a new one and I also thought we could ask if anyone from the congregation wished to make a specific donation towards this, or organise a fund raising event, but obviously this will take time. Roy and Lynne, in order to help, then offered to purchase it now on behalf of the church and receive payment back once we had raised the money back. I felt this was a very generous offer on their behalf and thanked them both very much. Roy has also contacted our councillor Malcolm again and explained the situation. Malcolm asked Roy to send him an email requesting financial support so we will wait and see if that is successful too.
