Benevolent Fund

The charity we shall support at the Communion at the Covenant service on 18th January is the Alder Hey Children's Charity. It raises vital funds to help make Alder Hey Children's Hospital a truly world-class, patient-friendly hospital for the 330,000 patients and families it cares for every year. Without the Charity's help, it would not be able to enhance the hospital to give children and families the very best experience.

Children and young people have very different requirements from a hospital than adult patients. The charity recognises this and helps to fund state-of-the-art equipment and a range of activities and projects that are designed to enhance and improve the lives of young patients when they are being treated.

The charity funds specialist medical equipment which ensures the surgeons and clinical staff have the most up-to-date state-of-the-art technology available to them – often equipment that is just not available via the NHS. It will also fund hi-tech distraction equipment proven to reduce pain and anxiety in many patients. Donations help the charity to support a vast range of programmes and special projects such as ward musicians, the on-site magician, and play specialists on every ward. The ground-breaking ward-based chef programme ensures the hospital is delivering healthy and nutritionally balanced food to all patients when they need it most.

In the last few years, donations large and small have enabled it to complete an incredibly important new research and education facility, to fundi fully the design and construction of a brand-new bereavement centre on the hospital campus and ensuring the brand-new residential mental health unit functions as a home from home for those young people that need its help the most.

Alder Hey Cardiac Unit look after Jane and Stuart's Granddaughter Delilah's health; she has had several operations two of which have been open heart surgery; and she attends many ongoing check-ups and tests etc. All the staff in this unit from surgeons and nurses are most caring and kind to Kim and Laurence when they have to stay in with Delilah.
