MINISTER'S MESSAGE December 2023

Dear Friends

As I write this, we are only in the first week of Advent and I already feel that I'm behind with my Christmas preparations. I am sure many of you are in a similar situation to me - although maybe there are one or two of you who wrote your Christmas Cards in October! Some of this panic is induced by the Black Friday phenomenon and also the fact that certain organisations hold Christmas special events in November!

The fact is that Advent and Christmas will happen whether we are ready or not; it won't be the end of the world if we get to January and somethings never got done.

The Methodist Church is encouraging us to experience things that are "Out of the ordinary" this Advent and Christmas. We are challenged to scratch beneath the surface and find the wonders of God' presence. Where is Jesus shining within us, in the people we meet and in creation? Words from "O Little Town of Bethlehem" are used to remind us that:

They are committed to helping people find accommodation and maintain a home and learn the life skills essential for independent living. As you can imagine Christmas is a particularly difficult and emotional time and the centre try to make this time a little better for anyone sleeping rough, offering a warm welcome, Christmas lunch and a gift. They will also be distributing gifts and Christmas treats to over 900 clients around the city. For many, this will be their first Christmas without their own home. This is their specific Christmas Wishlist for gift bags for the men, women and children they support. Chocolate Selection boxes. New pyjamas. New boxers and socks. Toiletry gift boxes for men and women. Hats, scarves, gloves. Christmas food treat. Stocking fillers.

We also support two Refuge centres for women and children fleeing from many kinds of abuse. A YMCA centre who accommodate both men and women in difficult circumstances, helping them to find a better life with accommodation and job seeking.

Centre 56: who we have supported for very many years, who provide domestic abuse support for families and children. Providing childcare, information and support for families.
