Benevolent Fund

The benevolent fund collection at the communion service on 27 July will be for Open Doors. Kathy Till of Open Doors will be giving the children's talk and preaching the sermon on that day.

The ministry of Open Doors has its origins in 1955 when a young Dutchman went to Warsaw and discovered the existence of a persecuted church. He became known as Brother Andrew, and from 1955 to 1967 he travelled throughout Eastern Europe, delivering Scriptures, encouraging persecuted believers, and recruiting others to help him. Open Doors continues this ministry. Every day, millions of Christians risk their lives to follow Jesus. In more than 70 countries, Open Doors supports them by supplying Bibles, providing emergency relief and helping persecuted believers stand strong for the long-term. In the UK and Ireland, Open Doors helps the church to pray, give and speak out for those who share our faith but not our freedom.
