

Benevolent Fund

In the season of remembrance, the Benevolent Fund collection at the communion service on **26 November** will be devoted to the Royal British Legion.

This is the country's largest Armed Forces charity, with 180,000 members, 110,000 volunteers and a network of partners and charities; giving support wherever and whenever it's needed. It provides lifelong support to serving and ex-serving personnel and their families. Its support starts after one day of service and continues through life, long after service is over – from providing expert advice and guidance, to recovery and rehabilitation, through to transitioning to civilian life. And not just for members of the Armed Forces, but for their families too.

Every year in November, it distributes paper poppies to raise vital funds to help today's Armed Forces community. It remembers those who lost their lives on active service in all conflicts; from the beginning of the First World War right up to the present day, as well as all those who have served in the forces and their families.
